COMMUNITY

The Kenston Local School District encompasses the townships of Auburn and Bainbridge and is adjacent to Chagrin Falls. The system is located in a rapidly growing residential community with an above average income, twenty-five miles east of downtown Cleveland. Approximate population is 13,000. The 1993-94 school year begins Kenston's 41st year.

SCHOOL

Kenston High School is a public four year comprehensive high school with a population of 715 students. The school is accredited by the North Central Association and the State of Ohio.

FACULTY

The Kenston High School faculty and administration number 60 with 60% having earned advanced degrees. The average teaching experience is 17 years.
