# SAT

The Scholastic Aptitude Test is taken during the junior and senior years by many students applying to college. The test provides verbal and math aptitude scores. The test scale is 200-800 per section. In 2014-2015, 116 students took the test.

# ACT

Many students applying to college take the American College Test during their junior and senior years. The test provides a combined aptitude/achievement score in English, reading, science, math and a composite score. The test scale is 1-36. In 2014-2015, 360 students took the test.
