

Dear Kenston Families,

The Timmons Preschool Special Education Peer Role Model program is a unique opportunity for preschool aged children to model classroom behavior and skills for children who have developmental delays. Children who participate in the Peer Role Model program gain confidence in a school routine that will prepare them for kindergarten.

A peer role model is a child without a disability who displays typical development and behavior in the classroom setting. A peer role model enhances the education of special needs students by being a helper, a leader, and a friend. Peer role models help special needs students reach their learning goals through play and social interactions. Peers also model typical school behaviors such as sharing, turn taking, and participation. In return, our peers learn confidence, empathy, and school readiness skills. All students in the program participate in a variety of developmentally appropriate preschool activities. Peer role model students must model age-appropriate preschool behavior to be accepted into the program.

Each of our two special needs preschool classrooms has four role model slots, and preference is given to returning students first. Each class is taught by a certified Early Childhood Special Education teacher and a classroom aide. Children being considered for the Peer Role Model program, must first participate in a preschool screening. This screening will take place on **December 10, 2021**, between 9:00am-12:00pm., at Timmons Elementary school building, and December 17, 2021 will be used as a back-up date if it is needed. Once the applications are received, we will review them, and then contact families to participate in the screening.

If your child is accepted into the program, our classes take place Monday-Thursday. Our AM class is in session 8:35am-11:05am and our PM class is in session 12:50-3:20pm. Students will be placed in the class we feel they will be most helpful. <u>Transportation</u> is the sole responsibility of the parents/guardians.

Once we have made our selections of acceptance, based upon information from the screening, those families will receive further information by phone or email.

PEER ROLE MODEL SCREENING PROCESS

- Each child will be screened during a play based screening time.
- We will be running the sessions as a mock preschool day from drop-off to pick-up.
- Students must be potty-trained, independent of self-help skills, have appropriate social skills, good language skills, and we would prefer they have a year of preschool already (this is not a must)
- A checklist to document social interaction, behavior, fine motor, and pre-academics will be completed by our school team.
- Articulation and language will be screened using the PLS-5 (Preschool Language Scales) screener by our speech/language pathologists.
- Students will complete an art activity, with the classroom teacher to determine if they have preschool readiness fine motor skills.
- Students will be given scheduled bathroom breaks. During the breaks the students will need to demonstrate independence.
- Once the session is over, the team will meet and review the data collected to determine if the student met the criteria to be placed into one of the available slots.
- Those students meeting the criteria, will receive a phone call or email with further information. Those students not meeting the criteria, will receive a letter in the mail.

2021-2022 Peer Role Model Enrollment Application

Kenston Local Schools Preschool offers an inclusive preschool program for students 3-5 years old <u>who reside within our district</u>. Our preschool consists of two half-day special needs classrooms with four role model students in each class. All Kenston preschool teachers are state certified Special Education teachers with each having a Masters degree.

- Peer role model students are accepted at the Kenston Preschool based on the following criteria:
 - o The child is at least three years old, preferably child has a year of preschool experience
 - o The child is toilet trained at the time of enrollment and independent of help
 - o The child is motivated, participates and is accepting of adult direction
 - o Speech intelligibility: 80% of speech is intelligible during out-of-context conversations
 - The child can answer "wh" type questions appropriately
 - Age appropriate self-help, behavior, social, and pre-academic skills are observed
- A <u>Parent Rating Form</u> is attached to this document and needs to be completed and returned, via email to <u>katie.seifried@kenstonapps.org</u>, or dropped off at the Timmons Elementary main office by December 6, 2021.
- The screening for role model placement will take place on December 10, 2021. The school team will contact
 parents as to what time their child will be assigned.
- Please let us know if your child has ever been evaluated through an agency, private provider, medical facility or through a school department? YES_____ NO____
- If yes, please provide copies of any evaluation information that you have to assist us in knowing your child as well as possible.
- The preschool team will review all the information on the screened applicant and determine if the child is
 appropriate for the program. We will then place a phone call to you to set-up a time for your child to come in for
 our play based assessment. This will be done individually this year for health safety.
- Placement into the program is based on eligibility and availability. Both classes are held Monday-Thursday, AM
 8:35am-11:05am, PM 12:50pm-3:20pm. The Kenston School District calendar is followed.
