

KMS Summer Reading 2024

<u>Requirements</u>: All students entering grades 6, 7, and 8 need to read at least **TWO** books of choice during the summer. Students should closely read the books for deep comprehension and analysis; they will complete a project about their summer reading at the start of the school year.

<u>How to select a book</u>: Use the following resources to help find an appropriate summer reading book. Find a book with a topic that interests your child and is at his/her reading level. As your child is selecting a book of his/her choice, please keep in mind that classrooms, schools, and public libraries provide a myriad of book choices covering a range of young adult topics. The genre of young adult literature has evolved over the years, and young adult novels often address many serious topics. We encourage you to ask your child what he or she is reading and preview the book for yourself to ensure that you find it appropriate for your family's guidelines.

- Access free digital books through the <u>Sora app</u> which is available on Chromebooks
